<u>Completion Time:</u> The reported completion time for this program, assuming continuous, full-time enrollment.

This program is designed to take 18months, over 6 terms at the College, to complete.

Note: The length of the program will vary based on individual circumstances such as choosing to attend less than full time, failing or retaking a course or courses, changing programs, or choosing to take a greater than full-time course load.

<u>Completion Rate:</u> The percentage of students who complete this program within the above stated time frame = 57.89%

Note: The completion rate is calculated based on the cumulative results of students at all locations that offer this program, who completed between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013. The completion rate is calculated using the formula provided by the U.S. Department of Education. It may not include all graduates who actually graduated from the program within the maximum allowable timeframe, which is 150% of the completion time stated above. Programs with less than ten completers will not show a percentage to protect the privacy of the limited number of students being reported.

<u>Placement Rate:</u> The job placement rate for students completing the program= 80%
