Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II & III Report – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

April 7, 2022

Southern Technical College (OPE ID: 02278800) received education stabilization funds under Section 314(a)(4) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law No. 116-260 and under Section 2003(a)(4) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP), Public Law No. 117-2. This Fund Report applies to funds received under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds II & III which are designated exclusively for emergency financial aid grants to students. Southern Technical College operates three campuses in OPE ID 02278800 under Title IV regulations.

The institution appreciates that Congress and the President have made these critical funds available for eligible students who have expenses related to the coronavirus pandemic. We take receipt of these federal funds seriously and are distributing them in accordance with the CRRSAA, ARP, and implementation guidance.

The institution is making the below information available for transparency purposes and in compliance with the U.S. Department of Education's ("Department") Electronic Notice of Public Posting Requirement of May 13, 2021 (Updated 9/30/2021). The institution was allocated and received \$1,048,584 in Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. All funds had been distributed to students as of July 8, 2021.

- 1. The institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used, or intends to use, the funds received under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA and under Section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
- 2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$1,747,065.
- 3. The total amount of emergency financial aid grants distributed to students under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP for the quarter ending March 31, 2022 is \$347,665 (cumulative total through March 31, 2022 is \$1,747,065.)
- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to receive emergency financial aid grants under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP in March 2022 is 830.
- 5. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP for the quarter ending March 31, 2022 is 782 (cumulative total through March 31, 2022 is 1,631 distinct students.)

- 6. The method used by the institution to determine which students receive emergency financial aid grants and how much they would receive under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP is:
 - i. The institution prioritized students with exceptional need, as required by CRRSAA and ARP, by only awarding grants to Pell eligible students.
 - ii. Students were required to complete an "Application and Acknowledgment" shown in Attachment A, in order to receive funds.
 - iii. Pell eligible students who were active or on a leave of absence on February 15, 2021, who were negatively impacted by Covid-19 and therefore eligible for emergency relief, were awarded \$550 each.
 - iv. Pell eligible students who were active or on a leave of absence on September 10, 2021, who were negatively impacted by Covid-19 and therefore eligible for emergency relief, were awarded \$1,000 each.
 - v. Pell eligible students who were active or on a leave of absence on February 14, 2022, who were negatively impacted by Covid-19 and therefore eligible for emergency relief, were awarded \$445 each.
